General Secretary.

All were accepted.

A letter had been received from BCF South East Div. about promoting track racing at Herne Hill. The Secretary had already replied saying it was unlikely as the club was not in a position to take this on at the present time.

An agenda for the RTTC London South AGM had been received.

The BCF had written asking for comments from clubs about restructuring of the Federation.

An agenda for the SCCU AGM had been received.

A letter from the Bicycle Polo Assoc. of Great Britain about cycle polo at Herne Hill stadium. A notice had already been put on the club noticeboard.

The BCCA had written advising about club affiliations for 1994.

With regard to a possible grant from the Foundation for Sport and the Arts, the Secretary suggested three track cycles for club use and had obtained costs for these in anticipation for submitting an application. The club may have to pay some of the costs towards the purchase.

Treasurer

PC reported the club had £636.43 in current account, £1225.95 in deposit account and £438.72 in clothing account.

In preparing the annual accounts, it had been noted the BCF subscription had been paid twice. The Secretary was pursuing this with the BCF divisional registrar.

PC had obtained some costs for casual club clothing and showed some samples of what was available. Tee-shirts costed out at £11.50 each and sweatshirts £14.00 each. Similar products from another supplier, using a different printing process, appeared slightly cheaper. A notice to be placed on the club noticeboard to see response from members before committing club funds.

Time Trial Secretary.

RS distributed results of club championships for the year.

Carl Davis had won the club Championship with 26.270 mph from Dave Williams with 25.624 mph. Carl had also produced the fastest 10 (21.59) and fastest 50 (1.59.54). Andy Murray recorded the fastest 25 (56.21) and Alan Parkinson the fastest 100 (4.57.28). Dave Wright was Vets BAR.

The Hill Climb event was this week-end.

RS thought about 35 members had ridden a 10 during the year and club events had been well supported throughout. In 1994 it was hoped to combine some of our club events with the Epsom CC.

RS had organised the recent Invitation time trial at Cranleigh and this had gone off smoothly. The field had been rather disappointing though the event was well supported by the membership with regard to marshalls etc. RS had decided to run an open event next year and move the date to April if possible. There would still be a limited field and the race would use a new circuit based at Beare Green.

Road Race Secretary.

RR reported members had been riding and performing well in road events throughout the year. Alan Parkinson had won a Surrey League event recently with Simon Jordan 2nd. Simon had also scored a win himself and had won the club 3rd Category Trophy.

Steve Gowar had been placed in many events and retained the Senior club title.

Andy Swanson had won the Vets title.

Martin Hulbert and Simon Jordan had completed the Maltese stage race with guest rider Gary Dodds. Ray Robinson had gone as manager.

RR had organised the recent club SL road race at Alfold which had gone well. A profit of £68.70 had been made on the teas.

RR indicated he would like to stand down as RR sec. at the AGM and also hand over responsibility for Surrey League entries to someone else.

The cyclo-cross would be held on January 2nd at Shirley Hills.

The Track Champion was Colin Parkinson with 29 points.
