1999

At the 1998 AGM all 38 members present voted to accept sponsorship from Tippetts Honda Ltd. for the next two years. This has been mutually beneficial to both parties and will hopefully prove to be a long standing arrangement. All committee positions were filled and long term member Robert Squirrel was elected to life membership.

Our Annual Re-union and Prize Presentation at the Surrey Hills Hotel on the 16th January was attended by 80+ members and guests who all, I'm sure, had a great time. Tony Doyle was kind enough to present the trophies and give an after dinner speech and more than one member has said that being given the award by the six times World Champion made the evening all the more special. Thanks to Geoff Redhead for organising and to Penny Wright for the lovely flowers. The year 2000 will be the club's 70 anniversary and should be a special occasion.

Turbo training was again drawing good support from the club regulars and will be starting in time to get an early start for the new season.

The Roller Racing final was won by the hard riding Ian Maylin with John Haschka in second place.

Unfortunately the Parkinson 2-up had to be moved to Hungry Hill due to road works on the normal course. This did not have any effect on the determination showed by the entrants and the event was hard-won by new member Peter Wright and long term sponsor Gary Smith.

A training weekend at Eastbourne was organised by Geoff Redhead on March 20th and was enjoyed by 21 members with support from Evans cycles.

March also saw a club room film show on the previous years pro. racing season and was well attended by both our own members and members of several other local clubs.

The April training camp in Majorca with Gary Smith was first class and a good number of club members got some early season training in near perfect conditions.

80 riders took part in our club randonnee in May and many who rode said that it was the best organised event they had ever had the pleasure of riding in. Thanks to Bob Maylin, Tony Sayers and Dave Wright for organising and to all who helped in so many ways to make this an event to be proud off.

Eighteen new members joined in '98 to continue the upward trend from last year.

As usual, club runs organised by Bob Maylin have been taking place all year and have been well supported by new and old members alike. Bob's runs continue to be the best recruiting ground for club membership that we have. "La Fleche Lorraine was an excellent club ride in good weather which saw 15 members take part some of whom came home with gold. The club was sent an award by the organisers for best overseas club attendance. Whilst on the randonnee events, seven club members rode the Etape de Tour in July and ten rode the Stephen Roche in September.

In time trials we have had a better year than last with new Hon TT Sec John Harris getting to grips with the club's most difficult job and club riders attaining personal bests etc.. One of the club's top vets, Paul Foster went under the hour with 59:49 on the G25/18 and Ruth Hutton had a PB on the G10/56 of 23:36. Dave Bugden has had yet another fine season with a 1:58:50, 50m, 55:39.25m and 21:52.10m, making him Club Champion. The Bill Reed*1 winner is Paul Foster and Bill Reed*2 is Dave Bugden. The Hart Trophy goes to Alex Parsons as Junior TT Champion. The Points Award is won by Paul Foster and the Hill Climb Champion is Ian Maylin/Keith Bugden both with the same time. Vets. Hill Climb Champion is Keith Bugden.

On the road race scene the club has organised both new and old events and all have been a great success thanks to a lot of hard work by the committee members involved.

The club Road Race Champion is Scott Bugden with 46 BCF points and he finished an outstanding season by making 2nd Cat..

Club 3rd/4th Cat. Champion is Ian Maylin with 25 BCF points who made 3rd Cat.. in a good season.

Veteran Club Champion is Andy Swanson who had a very good season including riding well in the Vets. World Championships.

We have a new Track Sec. in John Haschka and to show us all how to do it on the track he has had an outstanding season. Having gained 70 points over the year he rode in the LVRC Track Championships, was 1st in the pursuit, 2nd in the flying 2-laps, 3rd in the sprint and 3rd in the scratch race. Overall JH won the silver medal. He then rode in the World Championships at Manchester and set PB's in the pursuit, kilo and flying 200 TT. and finished 14th, 15th and 17th respectively.

On a sad note, it was with much regret that we learnt of the death of Nobby Fry early in the year.

Tony Sayers had a dual role this year of both Newsletter Editor and Press Sec. as usual he performed them both to his own high standard. This resulted in a 1st class newsletter and some very good articles in the best local press.
